## Ford's Lead Caravan

The procession was led by Mr. and Mrs. Ford and Mr. Kingsford, who were riding in a Lincoln sedan. In the next car were Mr. and Mrs. Edison and in the third machine were Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Firestone, their son and Miss Bogue. Mrs. E. G. Kingsford, who had been invited to accompany the party, remained in Iron Mountain but may join them later.

Just how long the party will remain in Michigamme was not known when the campers left here. As Mr. Ford said, all arrangements are in charge of Mr. Edison, who has made no statement of his plans. It was believed, however, that they would spend tomorrow at Michigamme and then go to Sidnaw, where the Ford Lumber camps are located. From

there they will proceed to L'Anse, the site of another Ford enterprise, a sawmill, and then they may visit the copper country. The Ford yacht, Sialia, which took the party from Traverse City, Mich., to Escanaba, has gone to L'Anse so that it is unlikely they will visit Iron Mountain on their homeward trip.

The moving picture photographer accompanying the party said this morning he had taken 2,000 feet of film while in Iron Mountain. He expected to use 10,000 feet of film for the entire tour. The pictures are not for public exhibition, but are for Mr. Ford's own use. The photographer said he may return here later in order to take more pictures of the plant, a film record being kept of Ford enterprises and development in the peninsula.
